





This week, we focus on Russia, after President Vladimir Putin cemented his grip on power following a landslide election victory that was criticised by the West as lacking democratic legitimacy.

Meanwhile, a new report has said famine in besieged and bombarded Gaza is "imminent" as months of Israeli attacks have led to Palestinians experiencing catastrophic hunger. It came as the US reiterated its warning against Israel launching a ground incursion into the crowded city of Rafah.

Finally, boycotts over the Gaza war are hitting big brands in Southeast Asia despite local owners denying links to Israel.
